He practices general and endocrine surgery at Brigham and Women's Hospital and is professor in both the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Harvard School of Public Health and the Department of Surgery at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Gawande has been a staff writer for *The New Yorker* magazine since 1998 and has written four *New York Times* bestsellers: *Complications*, a finalist for the National Book Award in 2002; *Better*, one of the 10 best books of 2007 by Amazon.com; *The Checklist Manifesto* in 2009 and his most recent book, *Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End*, released in October 2014. He has won two National Magazine Awards, AcademyHealth's Impact Award for highest research impact on healthcare, a MacArthur Fellowship and the Lewis Thomas Award for Writing about Science.
