



New Children's Hospital to be Named After Studer Family

PENSACOLA, Fla. (May 4, 2016) - Sacred Heart Health System, a member of Ascension, the nation's largest non-profit and Catholic health system, hosted a ceremonial groundbreaking Tuesday for its new four-story children's hospital, which will be named The Studer Family Children's Hospital in honor of Quint and Rishy Studer.

Widely known and respected within the healthcare field as founder of the Studer Group, Quint Studer is a consultant who has worked with 900 hospitals over his 29-year career. Quint and his wife, Rishy, have been strong proponents for the development of Pensacola.

The naming of the new hospital was done to honor the Studers' efforts to improve healthcare across the country and improve healthcare for the children in the Pensacola community.

Debbie Calder, chair of the Sacred Heart Health System board, speaking to a crowd of several hundred physicians, associates and guests, said: "Sacred Heart is pleased to announce that we are renaming the hospital to honor two people who have been instrumental in making Pensacola a better place to live and to work. Sacred Heart is pleased to recognize a couple with passion for improving the health and education of children in our community, and a leader who has improved care to hospital patients across the country. On behalf of the Sacred Heart Board and leadership team, I am honored to announce that in recognition of the many good works of Quint and Rishy Studer, we will rename our facility as the Studer Family Children's Hospital at Sacred Heart."

Patricia A. Maryland, Dr.PH, President, Healthcare Operations and Chief Operating Officer of Ascension Health, said: "The leaders of Ascension appreciate Quint's many contributions of time and talent to guiding Sacred Heart, and we're grateful to Quint and Rishy for their tremendous support of the delivery of compassionate, personalized care for children in the Gulf Coast region."

In his remarks, Quint Studer thanked Sacred Heart and Ascension for investing millions of dollars in Pensacola to care for children. "We're very fortunate to have Ascension. We're very fortunate to have Sacred Heart," he said.

He told the attendees about a time he was traveling on a camping trip with his family in South Dakota and his son was badly injured in an accident and rushed to an unfamiliar hospital in critical condition. He worried about the level of care his son would receive until he spoke to a highly qualified pediatric surgeon.

“Parents want to know their child is in the right place,” he said. “When parents come to Pensacola and they come to the Children’s Hospital, they won’t worry about being in the right hospital, because they know they are in the right hospital.”

The opening of the new hospital is expected to add 100 Sacred Heart jobs for the local community. This growth of healthcare services will also enable recruitment of new pediatric specialists.

The new building will include:

- Pediatric Emergency Department and Trauma Center
- Six children’s operating rooms.
- Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).
- Pediatric Intensive Care,
- Pediatric Oncology Unit
- Pediatric satellite pharmacy
- Pediatric inpatient rehabilitation gym
- Child life playrooms

Sacred Heart Health System and Ascension have committed \$55 million, and Sacred Heart will raise the remaining funds from community supporters in order to complete all phases of the expansion.

David Sansing, chairman of the Sacred Heart Hospital Advisory Council, said the new facility would have multiple benefits: a larger facility that can provide specialized care to more children, more jobs in the Pensacola area, and consolidated inpatient care at the hospital that will be faster and more efficient. “Everything will be designed for children.”

The ceremonial groundbreaking of The Studer Family Children’s Hospital marks the beginning of a two-phase expansion for Sacred Heart. In addition to the new children’s hospital, Phase 1 will include an expansion to Sacred Heart’s Regional Perinatal Center, an inpatient unit for expectant mothers with a high-risk pregnancy. This expansion will be built off of the current perinatal wing and will allow space for more expectant mothers, many of whom stay in the unit for weeks or even months until their babies arrive. Sacred Heart is the region’s only Perinatal Center – one of only 11 in the state – and Northwest Florida’s only center designed for women with high-risk pregnancies.

Phase 1 of construction is scheduled for completion in 2018. Phase 2 will feature a complete renovation and expansion of Sacred Heart’s Maternity and Women’s Center. When pediatric services move from the third floor to The Studer Family Children’s Hospital, the Maternity and Women’s Center will expand to occupy the vacated space. This will grow the number of beds for mothers needing specialized maternity care from the hospital’s OB Emergency Care Center.
